Ribbons for Members

The ribbons that club members earn are:

- ◆ Best Speaker
- ◆ Best Evaluator
- ◆ Most Improved Speaker
- ◆ Most Improved Evaluator
- ◆ Best Table Topics Speaker

Ribbons Earned by Clubs in the Distinguished Club Program (DCP)

Distinguished: Earned either 5 or 6 of the DCP points and met the membership criteria. See the DCP for more information.

Select Distinguished: Earned either 7 or 8 of the DCP points and met the membership criteria. See the DCP for more information.

Presidents Distinguished: Earned either 9 or 10 of the DCP points and met the membership criteria. See the DCP for more information.

Ribbons Earned by Clubs for being the Home Club of a District Officer

Area Governor: An Area Governor claims a specific club as his/her home club.

Division Governor: A Division Governor claims a specific club as his/her home club.

Lt. Governor: A Lt. Governor (Education and Training, or, Marketing) claims a specific club as his/her home club.

District Governor: A District Governor claims a specific club as his/her home club.

Ribbons Earned by Clubs for Membership Building Activities

Talk Up Toastmasters: Awarded to clubs that adds five new members (new, dual or reinstated but not transfers or charters) in the months of February and March

Smedley Award: Awarded to clubs that adds five new members (new, dual or reinstated but not transfers or charters) in the months of August and September.

Beat the Clock: Awarded to clubs that adds five new members (new, dual or reinstated but not transfers or charters) in the months of May and June.

Most people appreciate recognition – for a job well done, achieving some milestone, setting a new record, and more. There are a number of ways within Toastmasters that recognition is given, to both the members and to their clubs.

Ribbons are one way within Toastmasters that recognition is noted. There are a number of them for the members, such as voted best speaker, being a guest of a club, and, winning a contest. Clubs can earn ribbons too. They receive ribbons for such things as achieving a level of distinction within the Distinguished Club Program (DCP), a membership building milestone, or, being the home club of a district officer.
